## Stampin' Up! Supplies:

- STAMPS -Christmas Gleaming bundle 153006
- PAPER - Blushing Bride CS131198, Basic Black CS 121045, Whisper White CS 100730
- INK - VersaMark 102283
- OTHER - Jolly Season die 150648, Black Stampin' Emboss Powder 146956. Heat Tool 129053, Clear Wink of Stella 141897, Frost White Shimmer Paint 147046, 3/8" Glittered Organdy Ribbon, Rhinestone Basic Jewels 144220, Basic Pattern Decorative Masks 150697, Palette Knives 142808, Shimmery White Embossing Paste 145645, Mini Glue Dots 103683, Multipurpose Liquid Glue 110755, Stampin' Dimensionals 104330, SNAIL Adhesive 104332.

## Cutting & Scoring:

- Blushing Bride - 11" x 4-1/4" card base score & fold at 5-1/2"), 2" x 3"
- Basic Black 3-7/8" x 5-1/8", 2" x 3"
- Whisper White - 3-3/4" x 5"

## Instructions:

- Secure Basic Pattern Decorative Mask over the Whisper White CS. Use a Palette Knife to spread an even layer of Shimmery Embossing Paste over the mask. Smooth the paste and carefully lift off the mask. Set aside to dry. Clean up mask and palette knife.
- Stamp the ornament in VersaMark ink on the 2" x 3" piece of Blushing Bride CS. Sprinkle Black emboss powder over the image and shake off the excess powder. Heat the powder with the Heat Tool.
- Brush on Wink of Stella over the body of the ornament. Brush the Frost White Shimmer paint over the top of the ornament. Tie a small bow using the Glittered Black Organdy Ribbon and secure to the "loop" of the ornament using a glue dot. Attach the rhinestones.
- Cut out "Tis the Season" using the Jolly Season die in Basic Black CS.
- Check to see if the Embossing Paste is dry. When dry attach the ornament using Stampin' Dimensionals. Apply Liquid Glue to the back of the die cut sentiment and attach it to the front of the card.
- Using SNAIL adhesive attach the Whisper White CS to the Basic Black CS and then to the Blushing Bride CS.
